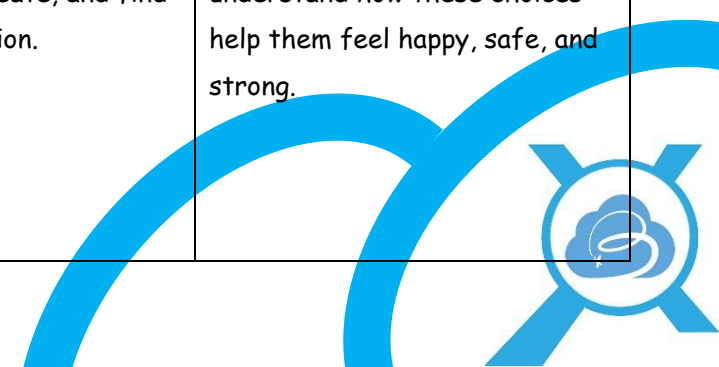
This term we are learning about

English	Maths	Science	Computing	PSHE/RSE
<p>This half term in literacy, we will use a variety of books to help develop children's understanding of characters and explore their thoughts and feelings throughout stories. Through reading, discussion, and role play, children talk about how characters feel and explain their ideas using what they know from the text. We will focus on sentence writing, practising the correct use of capital letters and full stops to make writing clear and accurate. Children will also work on <i>uplevelling</i> them by adding detail, improving word choices, and extending their ideas.</p>	<p>This half term in maths, we will focus on developing our counting skills to support and strengthen our understanding of times tables. We practise counting forwards and backwards in different steps, such as 2s, 5s, and 10s, to help recognise patterns in numbers. Through games, songs, and practical activities, children will build confidence and accuracy when counting, which helps them recall multiplication facts more easily. By linking counting to times tables, we support children in developing strong number sense and a secure foundation for future maths learning.</p>	<p>This half term in science, we will be exploring plants by learning about their different parts and discovering what they need to grow and stay healthy. Children will investigate roots, stems, leaves, and flowers and talk about the important roles each part plays. We will also focus on what plants need to grow well, such as water, light, and warmth. As part of our learning, we are growing and caring for our own <i>mystery seeds</i>, observing changes over time and taking responsibility for looking after them.</p>	<p>This half term in computing, we will learn about the different parts of a computer and what each one does. Children will explore devices such as the monitor, keyboard, mouse, and touchscreen, and talk about how they are used to help us work and play. Through practical activities and discussion, children begin to understand how computers help us write, create, and find information.</p>	<p>This half term in PSHE, we will focus on learning about keeping healthy and making positive, healthy choices. Children will explore what it means to be healthy, including eating a balanced diet, staying active, and looking after their bodies. We will talk about everyday choices and how these can affect our physical and emotional well-being. Through discussion and practical activities, children will be encouraged to think about how they can make healthy choices for themselves and begin to understand how these choices help them feel happy, safe, and strong.</p>



Geography & History	Art and DT	PE & Music	MFL & RE
<p>Geography This half term in geography, we will look at the seasons and explore how the world around us changes throughout the year. Children will observe how the environment looks different in each season, noticing changes in weather, daylight, and the landscape. We will also learn about the types of plants and animals found in each season and how they adapt to changes in temperature and conditions. Through discussion, observation, and practical activities, children develop an understanding of the world around them and how seasons affect living things.</p> <p>History This half term in history, we will learn about significant explorers from our past and consider why they are important. We will look at where these explorers travelled, what they discovered, and what life was like during their journeys. Children will explore what the explorers saw and experienced, and how their discoveries helped people learn more about the world.</p>	<p>Art This half term in art, we will focus on exploring colour and how it can be used in creative ways. Children will learn about primary and secondary colours and use the colour wheel to understand how colours are related. They will experiment with mixing colours to create different shades and tones, developing confidence in making choices about colour. These skills will then be used in their own creative pieces, encouraging creativity, experimentation, and enjoyment of the artistic process.</p> <p>Design and Technology This half term in design and technology, we will continue our learning about wheels and axles and how they help objects move. Children will explore how wheels and axles work together through investigation and hands-on activities. We will look at different types of vehicles and think about how they are designed to move smoothly. Using this knowledge, children will design and create their own moving vehicle, selecting materials carefully and testing how well their wheels turn.</p>	<p>PE This half term in PE, we will continue to develop our throwing and catching skills with a focus on moving while throwing and catching a ball. Children will practice throwing and catching with increasing accuracy while travelling in different directions, helping to improve coordination and control. Through games and partner activities, they will learn to position their bodies, watch the ball carefully, and move into space to receive a pass. These activities also support teamwork, awareness of others, and confidence when taking part in physical games.</p> <p>Music In music we are having one-to-one lessons focusing on learning new songs and having the chance to play and experiment with different instruments</p>	<p>MFL This half term in Spanish, we learn how to say the names of different animals, colours, and numbers up to 10. Children practise listening carefully and joining in with songs, games, and speaking activities to help them remember new vocabulary. We regularly repeat words and use them in fun, interactive ways to build confidence in speaking a new language. These lessons help children enjoy learning Spanish while developing early language and communication skills.</p> <p>In RE young people will be learning about the importance of stories in Hinduism and how they help Hindus live their lives. They will explore well-known stories from Hindu texts and traditional tales about Hindu gods and goddesses. Pupils will learn how these stories teach key values such as kindness, honesty, duty (dharma), respect for others and the importance of making good choices. Through listening, discussion and simple activities, students will see how stories help Hindus understand right and wrong, cope with challenges and guide everyday behaviour.</p>
